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Julia's Stole

The warmth and lightness of mohair combined with other fibers of your choice work together to compose this lovely stole. Raid your stash as this pattern uses no more than 2 balls of each yarn.

Materials:

Yarn: 2 balls mohair (Sample used Katia by Ingenua 78% mohair, 13% nylon, and 9% wool. 100 yds/140 meters)

2 balls wool boucle such as Schachenmayr's Nomotta Orlanda or textured yarn for contrast

2 balls fine cotton yarn (Sample used Rowan's 4 ply cotton)

3 skeins fine lace weight yarn in 3 different tones of the same color.

Needles: 13 US/9.0 mm needles

10 US/6.0 mm crochet hook

Gauge: 13 stitches to 4 inches/10 cm

Finished Dimensions: 52-3/4" x 15-3/4" (134 cm x 40 cm)

Pattern Sequence:

A = boucle and fine cotton together

B = Mohair

B1, B2, B3 = different lace weight shades

Row 1: With A knit

Row 2: With A knit (garter stitch ridge)

Row 3: With A knit 3 (includes 1 selvedge stitch), * B1 knit 2, A knit 2, * repeat * to *, end knit 3

Row 4: With A purl 3, *B1 purl 2, A purl 2, * repeat * to *, end purl 3
