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# Bavarian Strolling Socks (Spaziergang Socke)

A traditional colorway for Bavarian and Tyrolean lederhosen and jackets is a very dark forest green trim on a light grey garment. You might wear these comfy socks when going for an evening stroll. The leg and foot are a modification of an eyelet cable rib stitch from Barbara Walker's Treasury 1; the heel is two-color twined knitting and just at the toe is a three-row band of the twined knitting.

## Materials:

**Yarn:** Sport weight yarns or DK weight yarn 1 ball dark true green (CC) 2 balls pale grey (MC). Lopi Lite used in sample.

**Needles:** 3 US/3.25 mm double pointed needles for leg  
2 US/2.75 mm double pointed needles for foot, or size to get gauge

**Gauge on leg:** 3 US/3.25 mm needles is 7 st/in over 2 x 2 rib.

**Gauge on foot:** 2 US/2.75 mm is 8 st/in over stockinette stitch

**Finished Dimensions:** Using sport wt yarns, medium adult woman, size 7-1/2 to 8-1/2shoe, 9-1/4"/23.5 cm foot length

**Eyelet Cable pattern:** [multiple of 5 st]

Round 1: (P1, K3, P1) repeat across

Round 2: (P1, YO, Sl1, K2tog, PSSO, YO, P1) repeat across

Round 3: (P1, K3, P1) repeat across

Round 4: (P1, K1, YO, SSK, P1) repeat across

Round 5: (P1, K3, P1) repeat across

Round 6: (P1, K3, P1) repeat across
